
Health Hoekie (contd)

Medical risk factors

- High blood pressure
- Cigarette smoking or second-hand smoke exposure
- High cholesterol
- Diabetes
- Obstructive sleep apnoea
- Cardiovascular disease, including heart failure, heart defects, heart infection or irregular heart rhythm, such as atrial fibrillation
- Obesity and abdominal fat

Preventative Measures

- Monitor blood pressure
- Stop smoking
- Control cholesterol
- Keep blood sugar down
- Obtain sleep apnoea treatment
- Get active
- Eat better
- Lose weight if necessary
- Drink plenty of water



HEALTH HOEKIE

UNDERSTANDING STROKE

A stroke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked by a clot or bursts (ruptures). When that happens, part of the brain cannot get the blood (and oxygen) it needs, so it and brain cells die.

The brain is an extremely complex organ that controls various body functions. If a stroke occurs and blood flow can't reach the region that controls a particular body function, that part of the body won't work as it should.

TYPES OF STROKE

1. Ischaemic Stroke (Clots)

Occurs when a blood vessel supplying blood to the brain is obstructed. It accounts for 87% of all strokes.

2. Haemorrhagic Stroke (Bleeds)

Occurs when a weakened blood vessel ruptures. The two types of weakened blood vessels that usually cause haemorrhagic stroke are **aneurysms** and **arteriovenous malformations (AVMs)**. The most common cause of haemorrhagic stroke is uncontrolled **high blood pressure**.

3. Transient Ischaemic Attack (TIA)

A “warning stroke” caused by a temporary clot. Take this warning sign for stroke seriously and call an emergency service immediately. [Once your provider has determined the cause of the TIA, the goal of treatment is to correct the issue and prevent a stroke].

4. Cryptogenic Stroke

In most cases, clots that block blood flow to the brain cause a stroke. Sometimes, however, the cause of a stroke can't be determined. This is called a cryptogenic stroke.

They became engaged late in 1952 and married in July, 1954, when Toni was almost 21. Wilfried's father helped them start their own farm. Three children soon followed in quick succession, two daughters and a son 18 and 15 months apart and another son after 4 years. After about 12 years, they sold their farm and bought one in the OFS between Bethlehem and Petrus Steyn. The following few years were hard for the couple and their family. As the farmstead was rudimentary, a new one had to be built, and the maize and wheat crops were not good. They secured a better future by buying a farm near Dundee in Natal where they spent about 20 successful and happy years before transitioning to a small-holding. After 5 years, they retired to Dundee itself for about 4 years. Their younger daughter, Ingrid, being concerned about their welfare, persuaded them to come to Bloemfontein where she and her husband lived. She found them a cottage at BWV where they took occupation in 1999. This was Providence at work, believes Toni, as Wilfried died only 5 months later.

Their elder son, Egmont (Monty) a CA, now lives in Australia. Their elder daughter, Lynette, works with her husband, an insurance broker in Pietermaritzburg. Sadly Ingrid died after undergoing a surgical procedure. Her widowed husband, Henry Baptiste, physically challenged following a stroke, also resides at BWV. Roland, the younger son, lives in Pretoria. Toni has altogether 9 grandchildren and 17 great-great grandchildren, a number of whom live in Australia.

Recently Toni moved from the B passage to a larger room in the new D section where she has settled well, slowly becoming accustomed to no longer having direct access to the garden as she had in her previous room. Having turned 90 recently, she is no longer as mobile as she was, tires easily and spends her time quietly in her well-organized and comfy room.



GOLDEN OLDIE

TONI MUHL

In 1881, a German immigrant couple settled on a farm in the Vryheid district in Natal amongst a largely German community. They were the grandparents of Antonia Tschirpig, known as Toni, and had eight children, four boys and four girls, her father being the youngest. Toni's grandfather unofficially named the district "Gluckstadt" and was responsible for visiting the German farmers and arranging for them to make bricks with which the local Lutheran church was built. After her grandfather died, her grandmother stayed with Toni's family on the farm until her death when Toni was very young.

Toni was the first-born of five, the youngest little sister being a proper "laatlammetjie" and close in age to Toni's own children. She grew up on the family farm and walked a distance to attend a government school in the district up to Standard 4. She was then a boarder at the German Hermansburg High School near Greytown, leaving after Standard 8. Though a co-educational school, Toni recalls with amusement, the boys and girls were strictly separated after school hours. Back on the farm, she worked at the nearby trading store for a few months until being persuaded by her mother to enroll at the Huishoudskool in Potchefstroom where she matriculated with a variety of domestic skills.

After leaving school and once again back on the farm, her mother encouraged her to socialize with the group of German youngsters in the neighbourhood. The 1952 Van Riebeeck Festival was coming up and the group prepared to take part in the German Volkspede at the festival. One day while German dancing groups from all over the country were camped together at an arena in Cape Town, a young man from her group but hitherto unknown to Toni asked her why she was holding a hankie to her nose. Taken aback, she felt it was none of his business. After introducing himself as Wilfried Muhl, he explained that he knew her sister and younger brother from school. He paid for her ticket and bought her an ice cream when they went somewhere by bus, the start of a romance. He later admitted to deciding then already that Toni was his future wife. After the festival, Wilfried found ways of visiting her although their family farms were a fair distance apart on opposite sides of the town of Vryheid.
